

## The Architectural Team announces new Boston scholarship programme

The firm marks its 50th anniversary by enabling underrepresented students at Boston's Wentworth Institute of Technology to access and afford an education in design

'The Architectural Team Endowed Scholarship' is a need-based scholarship; eligible for students pursuing degrees in Wentworth's School of Architecture & Design. The programme serves as a

pipeline into professional practice, which directly combats long-standing accessibility issues within the industry.

The Architectural Team's (TAT) \$25,000 contribution will be dollar-matched by funds from the Wentworth endowment, as part of the school's Advancing Student Access and Potential (ASAP) Challenge programme. This will significantly enhance the scholarship's impact for up to two architecture students per scholarship cycle.

Scholarship recipients will also have the option to apply for a one-semester co-op opportunity at TAT, to help them build professional experience and networks.

"We are delighted to continue our strong partnership with The Architectural Team," says Mark Mulligan, Associate Dean of Wentworth's School of Architecture and Design. "This scholarship is critical to the University's mission to expand access to the profession of architecture by supporting our talented and diverse students."

The announcement of the scholarship stems from the philosophy of TAT's founder, Robert J. Verrier, FAIA, NCARB, who passed away this year. Verrier inspired generations of architects with a steadfast belief in the potential of architecture to engender civic pride, revive local economies, and transform communities.

According to TAT leaders, the scholarship also deepens the strong relationship with Wentworth. Hundreds of students have worked in TAT's offices through Wentworth's co-op program, and more than 30 out of 95 current TAT staff are graduates of the university, including three of the firm's six principals.

TAT is known for a wide array of work, including urban infill complexes, creative master planned communities, engaging mixed-use destinations, resilient waterfronts, historic preservation and adaptive reuse, and uplifting affordable housing and senior developments.

Applications open in early 2022 for the 2022-23 academic year.
